PRINCIPAL'S NOTE

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Looking forward to a great new year!

One of the main changes in the transition to Phase 3 of COVID-19 re-opening is the increase in group size for social gatherings from five to eight. Food and beverage establishments will adapt to this very quickly to accommodate more customers seated at a table. As capacity limits at other public places increase, other establishments will also need to make similar adjustments in how they operate. All of us will still have to ensure that Safe Management Measures (SMM) are in place, such as wearing masks and keeping our safe distance.

At Xingnan, we too are preparing for transition. We are ready to welcome our 7 classes of new P1 pupils in 2021. We hope our XCITE programme for the lower primary together with our conducive classroom learning environment will smoothen this transition process from pre-school to primary school.

The transition process is a journey that takes place over time and is not a one-off event. A child's transition journey begins well before the first day of primary school and may ease to a close when the child feels that he or she has adapted to life in primary school. This duration may vary for each child, depending on his/her individual learning and behavioural needs. We have to work closely with parents, families, other support staff and external agencies to ensure that every child will transit smoothly and be able to find joy in coming to school.

We have transition plans for the rest of the levels, especially for our P2 and P4 pupils who will move to new classes with a new set of classmates. This is why we focus our efforts on our Start-It-Right (SIR) programme at the beginning of each new term as well as on sharing relevant information of pupils to the new teachers/schools. Transition will require our pupils to make adjustments. What remains constant will be how we work hard on staying steadfast on our values and striving for excellence.

All of us have transitions to make throughout our lives. At Xingnan, we want to start early and provide our pupils with the right support so that they will learn to be self-directed to manage their own transitions in the future. These could be transitions in their education journey, careers and even in their personal lives.

Let's continue to build a strong partnership between school and families.

CCA CAMP INSPIRED





FAREWELL CLASSES OF 2020 2020 PSLE RESULTS

Once again, our pupils did the school proud by achieving 99.2% overall passes. Out of all the candidates taking standard subjects who were eligible for secondary school, 61.5% of them qualified for the Express Course, an increase of 3.5 % from the previous year.

29 pupils taking standard subjects scored 250 and above, an increase of 15 pupils from the previous year, while 5 pupils taking foundation subjects topped the foundation cohort. 31 pupils were posted to secondary schools via Direct School Admission – Secondary.

Observing SMM, our pupils, accompanied by one of their parents, reported to school to collect their results. They waited patiently in anticipation in the classrooms. Upon the release of the results, there were loud cheers and tears of joy.

Our pupils have certainly done the school proud and we congratulate them for their achievements and thank their parents for their unwavering support all these years. We also thank our teachers for their dedication and diligent efforts in guiding our pupils and bringing out the best in them.
